TO TO THE ONE ONE

After responding, the interviewer pointed out to me that four of the five on my list were recorded before 1980. It made me think about why I like old albums more than new ones, in general, and the answer is simple.

I love hearing human beings play music. No quantization, no prerecorded tracks, no Autotune - just people (generally all in the same room together) making wonderful, imperfect noise. I think that's why this band makes live albums- what you play is what you get. You're forced to live with your mistakes and are doomed to listen to them over and over again, but if the performance as a whole has the right spirit, you swallow your pride for the greater good, for the overall sound. This first installment (of what will hopefully be a very long series) of Family Dinner albums is no exception.

When I think back to the week of the recording, I remember feeling like I was plugged into an electrical socket.

I'm convinced that Snarky Puppy, the craziest group of non-incarcerated human beings that I know, is incapable of doing things the easy way. We've made a habit of creating nearly impossible challenges for ourselves, especially when it comes to making records. But I think that I can speak for every single member of the band when I say that it was the most intense six days of our musical lives.

I invited eight of my favorite solo artists to join us for this album (whose namesake and concept come from a music series we host regularly at New York City's famous Rockwood Music Hall) specifically because I know that they see music the way the band sees it,

and that they would be just as up for the nearly impossible as we were. On Monday night, we had a stage full of instruments and no music prepared. By Saturday evening, we had learned, arranged, rehearsed, performed, filmed, and recorded 19 songs by 11 different singers. It was absolute insanity. The band spent an average of 14 hours per day rehearsing, practically sleepless, while the film, stage, and audio crews turned yet another performance space into a film set and professional recording studio. The room was buzzing with electricity, every single person operating at 100% of their capacity. The performances were expressive, imperfect, and charged.

This record is about those little accidents... a drum flam, a cracked horn hit, a bass flub, and the raw expression of the human voice. We've left it all in. It is people, in the same room together, playing music.

We hope you feel the soul, heart, and spontanelty of the music exactly as we felt them over those two nights in Roanoke, and we thank you for supporting music education in the community.


